


Has man ever stood on the moon?

- *A significant person has a long lasting impact on our world.
- *Neil Armstrong was the first person to walk on the moon in 1969.
- *Apollo 11 was the historic mission to the Moon in 1969.
- *3 astronauts travelled to the moon: Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins.
- *Katherine Johnson planned the routes the astronauts used, Gene Kranz stayed on Earth and made the decisions, telling the astronauts what to do.
- *The sun is the centre of the solar system.
- *There are 8 planets in the Solar system. These are: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto (a dwarf planet)






