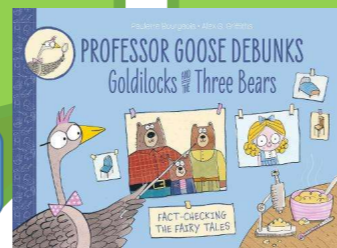
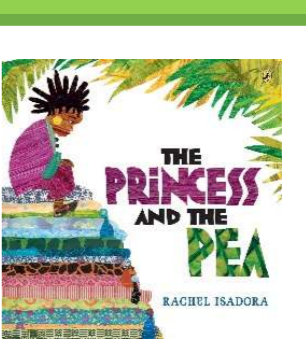
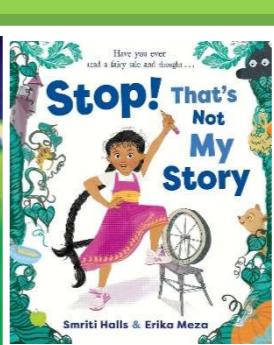
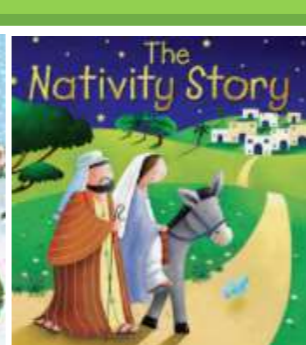
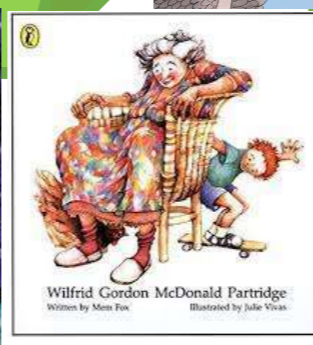
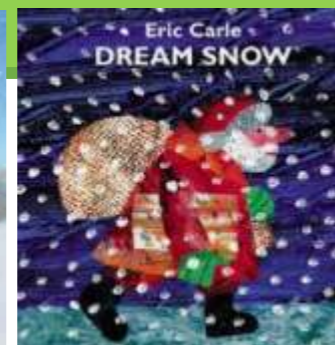
Key Knowledge

- **Remembrance Day** marks the anniversary of the date and time that the First World War ended.
- It is a time to remember all those who died in the wars so that we might live freely today.
- Remembrance Day is on the 11th November (eleventh day and the eleventh month).
- At 11:00 (eleventh hour), we hold a 2 minutes silence to think about the soldiers who sacrificed their lives.
- Poppies grow over the battlefields and are a symbol of Remembrance Day.
- Selling poppies helps to raise money to support soldiers.

Christmas – a Christian festival

- A Christian celebration to remember the birth of Jesus over 2000 years ago.
- The Nativity Story from the New Testament.
- Similarities and differences to other Christian festivals.
- The true meaning of Christmas (not all about the gifts).
