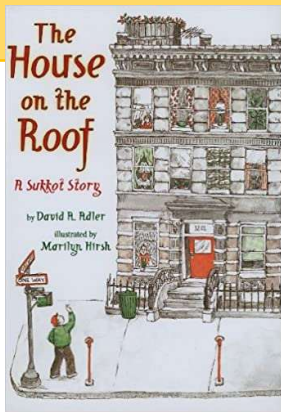
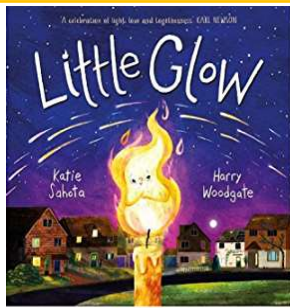
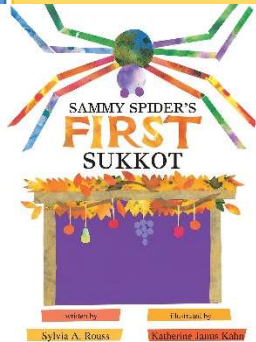
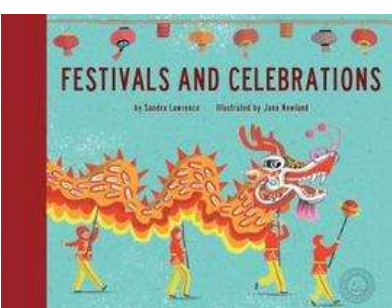
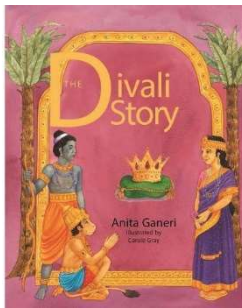
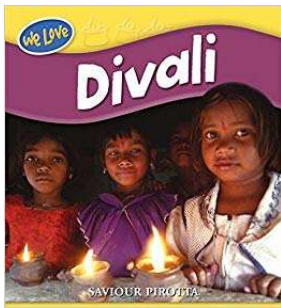
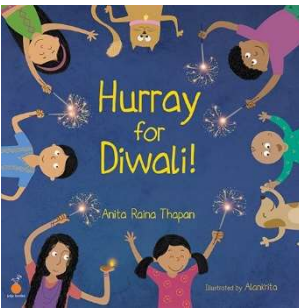
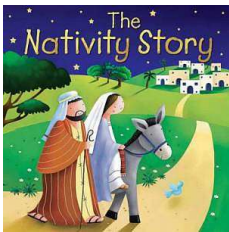
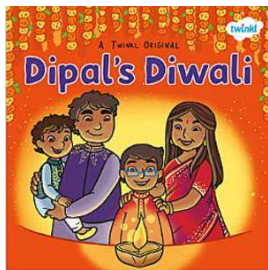
Festival		An event to celebrate a significant moment.

Respect		The good feelings we show towards others' beliefs and choices.
