## Knowledge:

- That the world is split up into many different time zones.
- Cartography is the study of maps
- There are invisible lines which split the world into coordinates- latitude and longitude.
- Flags of different countries represent the different values a country holds and have many different meanings.
- Towns and cities are located in strategic places due to their proximity to natural resources e.g. water.
- The Amazon Rainforest is the world's largest rainforest and spans 5.5 million km<sup>2</sup>
- The Amazon is found in South America, spanning across Brazil, Bolivia, Peru, Ecuador, Colombia, Venezuela, Guyana, Suriname and French Guiana.
- The Amazon has an incredibly rich ecosystem – there are around 40,000 plant species, 1,300 bird species, 3,000 types of fish, 430 mammals and a whopping 2.5 million different insects. Wow!
